Junior Amateur (92)	Less than 18 years old	Playing harp for more than 3 years or won 1 st place in the Junior Novice Division	An air & two contrasting pieces (solo only)	1 st Place Quaich 2 nd Place Medal Evaluation	2
Senior Novice (93)	Over 18 years old	Played harp for less than 2 years	An air & one contrasting piece (solo only)	1 st Place Quaich 2 nd Place Medal Evaluation	1
Senior Amateur (94)	Over 18 years old	Played the harp for more than 2 years	An air & two contrasting pieces (solo only)	1 st Place Quaich 2 nd Place Medal Evaluation	2

Additional Notes:

- No one may enter a lower division than that in which he/she participated in the past.
- All music must be Scottish (traditional arrangements, or original *{one only}* — in Scottish style).
- Competitors may be required to defend the connection of music chosen to the Scottish traditions.
- No ensembles larger than a duo will be permitted - (duos only where specified).
- Music must be performed on a non-pedal harp by memory and may be introduced, time allowing. • Order of competition shall be determined by drawing of numbers.
- The Harp Committee (Chair and stewards) may require proof of eligibility and may disqualify any competitor for misrepresentation, noncompliance with the rules, or inappropriate behavior. Decisions of the Harp Committee regarding eligibility, special circumstances, etc. are final.
- Official adjudication forms shall be filled out by judge(s) during performance. In each division a 1st and 2nd place winner may be declared. If there are too few competitors, or quality of performance does not merit it, one or both winners may not be declared.
- Special awards for excellence may be given at the discretion of the judge(s). (**Prize:** Medal and/or Performance Award Certificate).
- Decisions of the judges regarding winners and awards are final.
