TROPHIES:

Trophies will be awarded in events with 3 or more competitors

ENTRY PACKETS:

Entry packets will be sent out by September 6th. You will receive a parking pass only for the day of your contest. Should you not receive your packet, please report to the Chief Steward's Office at the Games.

SOLOISTS:

QUARTET CHALLENGE - Unsanctioned

Quartets will consist of any 4 pipers. EUSPBA or other piping organization memberships *not required*. Affiliation with a Band not required. Quartets can enter in both the Medley and the March Medley contests.

700 Quartet Medley

4-7 Minute Medley

Must contain a min of 3 different type of tunes, ie: March, Jig, Strathspey, Reel

Hornpipe, Slow Aire, Waltz

800 Quartet March Medley

3-5 Minute march medley (Any time signature)

ENTRY CLOSING DATE: Mailed: Postmared by September 1, 2025 Online: Sptember 3, 2025 The intended order of play will be in reverse order of the competitor's date of entry (first entered, last to play). Every effort will be made to avoid scheduling conflicts. The final order of play will be posted at the Chief Steward's Office. Competitors must check in with the Steward at each event. Failure to play at a scheduled time will result in disqualification for that event.

BANDS:

Band Parking: You will receive one (1) on-site pass for the band equipment vehicle. No additional band vehicles are permitted to enter the grounds. Bands will be assigned a set-up area.

Order of Play: Band representative must report to the Chief Steward's Office at 10:00AM on Saturday & Sunday for the band meeting

Travel: In order to receive travel expenses and prize money, bands must compete and participate in BOTH Opening & Closing Ceremonies unless excused by the Chief Steward's Office. Travel Expense for Saturday reimbursement will be limited to the first (5) entries received in each grade. Qualifying bands will receive a travel expense voucher which must be claimed the weekend of the NHHG&F

LATE ENTRIES:

Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the Chief Steward's Office and will incur a penalty fee which must be paid via credit card. Tickets will be held and must be picked up at Will Call. No parking pass will be issued.

SANCTIONING:

All events, except where noted, are sanctioned by the EUSPBA and run according to its rules. Every solo competitor must be an individually registered member of the EUSPBA or of a reciprocating organization. Members of the reciprocating organizations must provide a copy of their registration card.

Competitors or band members who conduct themselves in a belligerent, devious, or unsportsmanlike manner will be removed from the competition area and/or the grounds at the discretion of the contest committee (2 members of the Chief Steward's Office & 2 EUSPBA representatives)

The NHHG&F reserves the right to make changes to events as long as their actions are within the EUSPBA rules and are deemed to be in the best interest of the New Hampshire Highland Games & Festival
